

Jeff from the Westminster area has this question: “*Chief Jenks, I wondering if Anna is offering a bad weather service of some kind other than the sirens. I was told Code Blue or something like that.*”

Jeff,

Absolutely! The City of Anna does offer an automated emergency weather notification telephone system to the area citizens and it is called “Code Red Weather.” The system will call you on up to two telephone numbers to let you know if severe weather is approaching. Citizens should enter themselves into the database by going to the Code Red web site through a link on the City of Anna’s website ([www.annatexas.gov](http://www.annatexas.gov)).

Once you get to the Code Red page, enter your data and then select which type of weather warnings you would like to receive a phone call about: Severe thunderstorms, Tornado warnings, Flash Flood, or any combination of the three. Once you are in the system, it will call you every time the weather service issues a warning for our area.

If for some reason a person no longer wants to receive Code Red Weather warning calls, or wants to change the type of calls you receive, simply go to the Code Red web site and reenter yourself with the updated options you want and the system will replace your old entry with your new one. To unsubscribe completely, simply redial the number after you receive a call and follow the instructions in the menu to. Thanks for the Email.
