### Sustainable Anna Community Through Planned Managed Growth

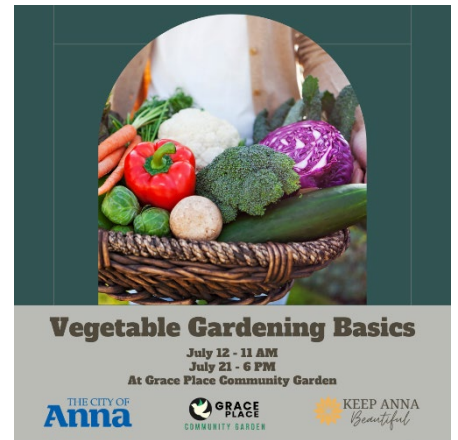
- Building Division received 4 new single family permit submittals and issued 73 new single-family permits.
  - The current fiscal year total is 878 single-family permits received.
- Held kickoff meeting for construction Fire Station 2 project.
- Held meeting with Camden Parc developer to review impact fee reimbursements and capital improvements constructed.
- Collin Pump Station ground storage tank has been disinfected, power has been restored, and staff is installing check valves next week and testing pumps.
- Hurricane Creek Temporary Lift Station diesel pump is being moved to upstream manhole, plugging line, installed 200' of additional force main.
  - Equipment is on hand and installation has been scheduled.
- GIS created notification maps for two zoning cases and one residential replat as well as an overview map of all development projects submitted on June 8<sup>th</sup>.
- GIS Intern digitized water features for 9 residential subdivisions this week.
- Street Division
  - Meet with a neighbor regarding drainage issues on Oak Circle and gathering quotes for repairs.
  - Coordinated with County and TxDOT for road repairs to CR286.
  - Worked with TxDOT and Consolidated Traffic Controls (CTC) on signal updates for City-owned Opticoms units.
  - Mowed grass alongside CR 370, 376.
  - Trimmed low-hanging branches on N Riggins St, S Sherley Ave, E 8th St, E 7th
  - Repaired streetlights at Ferguson Pkwy and Madison Dr, Sheldon Dr and Norwood Dr and Buffalo Bill Dr and Doc Holliday Dr, Parker Dr and Curt St
  - Pulled forms and backfilled at 132, 128, 124, 120 Hilltop Dr, replacing 16 sidewalk panels.
  - Move boxes and furniture from old City Hall to the New City Hall.

- Repaired down stop sign at West Crossing Blvd and W White St.
- Installed new street signs at 2nd St and N Powell Pkwy, Charleston Dr and Mitchell Ln, Thousand Oaks Dr and Magnolia St, Parker Dr, and Ryan St, and Parker Dr and Curt St.
- Repaired concrete mixer by welding new supports for stability.
- Eliminated trip hazard on sidewalk at 200 Salisbury Dr.
- Engineering & Construction Division
  - Issued review comments for an engineering plan submittal for Utility Relocations along US 75.
  - Met with JC Millwork to address issues with City Hall building.
  - Completed a total of 38 ROW Inspections
  - Completed a total of 27 Flatwork Inspections
- Utility Division
  - Residential Meter Installations: 25, Commercial Meters: 1
  - Meter reads: 936, Meter Disconnects: 37, Meter Reconnects: 34
  - Valves exercised: 10 various locations
  - Water main leaks scheduled for repair: 1 Repaired: 2, 1.5” and 3” mains repaired.
  - Water service leaks scheduled for repair: 1 Repaired: 1, will be repaired by the builder.
  - Sewer line cleaned: 1,500 ft. within Anna Town Square

- Facilities
  - Coordinated City Hall staff move from the old building to the new building.
  - Made address service requests associated with the City Hall move.
  - Coordinated door repair at the old City Hall.

### *Anna – A Great Place to Live*

- Patrol officers responded to 373 calls for service, conducted 194 traffic stops, investigated four minor accidents and two major accidents.

- Officers made one felony arrest and eight misdemeanor arrests.
- Criminal Investigations Division filed eight misdemeanor cases and one felony with the Collin County District Attorney's Office.
- Anna PD, Anna ISD PD, and Anna ISD Admin held a joint meeting discussing school safety and Municipal Court referrals for certain offenses.
- Fire Operations Division responded to 41 calls for service and provided 2 mutual aid responses.
- Fire Command Staff met with AMR (American Medical Response) staff to discuss emergency medical dispatch options.
- Fire Command Staff attended the monthly Collin County Fire Chief's Association meeting.
- Conducted an interview for open park maintenance position.
- Parks staff researched splash pad pump and options to repair splash pad.
- Parks crew spread any bait at Slayter Park and Natural Springs Park.
- parks crew prepped fields for the adult softball league Tuesday and Wednesday night.
- Neighborhood Services and GIS created map depicting the code enforcement officer zones that will be added to the City website.
- Neighborhood Services began planning the Henry Clay Yank Washington Park Ribbon Cutting, which tentatively scheduled for July 12<sup>th</sup>.
- Neighborhood Services confirmed Vegetable Basics Gardening classes for July 12 and 21 in partnership with Grace Place Community Garden.
  - The classes are free and open to all ages.



### High Performing, Professional City

- Finance staff participated in National Incident Management System (NIMS) training.
- Municipal Court was held with 53 cases on the docket.
- City Secretary's Office staff participated in the Texas Municipal Clerk's Association Records Management training.
- IT Department closed 23 service tickets
- IT Department moved City Hall's Staff/equipment (12 employees, 22 monitors, 10 desk phones, 12 computers, 1 multifunction printer) and INC Cube's staff/equipment (12 employees, 22 monitors, 13 computers) over to our new City Hall.
- Human Resources Department partnered with TMLIRP Loss Prevention team to host two training sessions for staff.
  - The training series consisted of Environmental Safety Presentation on Heat Stress & Poisonous Plants/Insects and TML R.O.A.D Ready Presentation.
- Human Resources Department met with the city's TMLIRP Loss Prevention Representative to discuss staff's current safety training efforts, recent safety trends, claims reporting, and additional training resources.
